## FOR ROCKEFELLER STUDENTS: KNOW YOUR RIGHTS

### Reporting Sexual Violence, Relationship Violence, or Stalking

Each student has the right to:

1. Make a report to local law enforcement and/or state police;
2. Have disclosures of sexual violence, including domestic violence, dating violence, stalking, and sexual assault, treated seriously;
3. Make a decision about whether or not to disclose a crime and/or violation and to participate in the University's investigation, hearing, and decision-making process and/or criminal justice process free from pressure by the University;
4. Participate in a process that is fair and impartial and provides adequate notice and a meaningful opportunity to be heard;
5. Be treated with dignity and receive from the University courteous, fair, and respectful health care and counseling services, where available;
6. Be free from any suggestion that the student or reporting individual is at fault when these crimes and/or violations are committed, or should have acted in a different manner to avoid such crimes and/or violations;
7. Describe the incident to as few University representatives as practicable and not be required to unnecessarily repeat a description of the incident;
8. Be protected from retaliation by the University, any University employee, personnel, and/or student; and/or the accused and/or their friends, family, and acquaintances within the jurisdiction of the University;
9. Have access to at least one level of appeal of a determination;
10. Be accompanied by an advisor of choice who may assist and advise a student, reporting individual or accused throughout the investigation, hearing, and/or decision-making process, including during all meetings and hearings related to such process; and
11. Exercise civil rights and practice of religion free from interference by the investigation, hearing, and/or decision-making process of the University.
